With a quorum present, Mr. Nieto called the meeting to order at 9:30 am.

- III. Motion to approve the Agenda Mr. Holguin requested that item X.A (election of officers) be moved to after Item V (oaths of office). The guest presentation (to be made by Ms. Nichols for Ms. Bloom) needed to be moved to after item IX (unfinished business) or until the projector arrived. With the aforementioned changes, Mr. Smith made a motion to approve the agenda. Mr. Holguin seconded the motion and it passed 5–0. {3:51}
- **IV. Motion to approve the Minutes of March 25, 2015 Regular Board Meeting** Mr. Holguin made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 25, 2015, regular board meeting. Mr. McMullen seconded the motion and carried 5–0. {3:51}
- V. Oaths of Office Mr. McMullen, Ms. Boothe and Mr. Sanchez were sworn in as directors of the Lower Rio Grande Public Water Works Authority. {6:30}
- VI. Guest Presentations: Tiffany Bloom, SCCOG—ICIP Presentation (Presented after Item IX, unfinished business) {48:44}
- VII. Public Input—15 minutes total allotted for this item, 3 minutes time limit per person—none
- VIII. Managers' Reports
 - A. General Manager Mr. Martin Lopez provided his written report and stood for questions.
 - Mr. Nieto asked about the wetlands decommission. The NM Environment Department has
 issued a permit outlining the decommission process. Staff is submitting a plan which is due May
 9, 2015. The plan includes removing solids to a qualified facility and backfilling the (now dry)
 wetlands.
 - There was a short discussion concerning the possible annexation by the City of Anthony of an area that is part of the LRGPWWA service area. Because the City of Anthony offers neither water nor sewer, there is no real issue.
 - The USDA-RD Earth Day event that will recognize the Mesquite, Brazito and Del Cerro Water Project has been moved to noon on April 22 at the Mesquite office. Plans should be finalized shortly and will be sent to board members.
 - Mr. Smith asked why the Organ system EPA notice of violation was so old. Evidently, the EPA
 had been sending it to post office box set up for Organ S&W by a previous bookkeeping
 company. Additionally, there was a misspelling in the address. Organ residents have been
 notified and the notice has been posted in offices and on the website.

• USDA-RD is having an open house at their new location and Mr. Lopez passed around the invitation. {15:48}

 - Mr. Holguin mentioned that in light of recent water issues, the brackish water treatment project was looking like a good idea. The planning report on that project is due at the end of April.
 - Mr. Nieto asked for an update on the Mesquite Wastewater Project. It has finally been closed out. There is \$114,000 left and it will be used for equipment. {33:50}

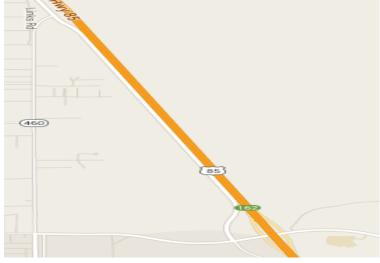

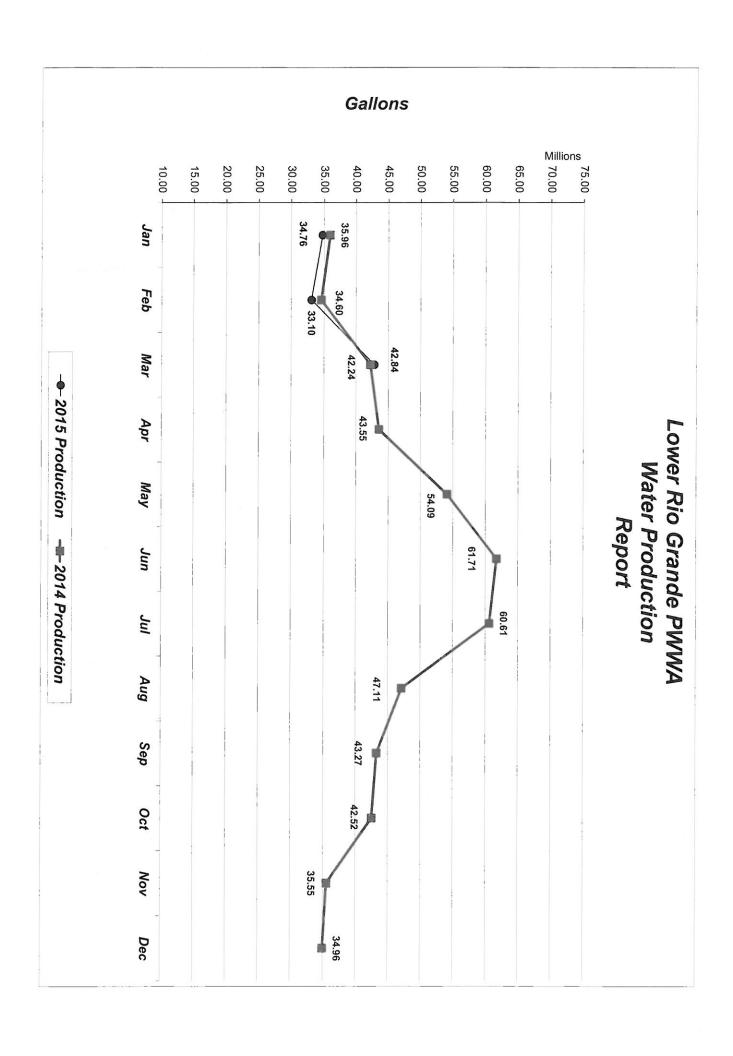

<u>LRG-11-03 – Interconnect & Looping Project – see 12-01 Authority PER</u>

LRG-11-04 - Berino/ Mesquite-Del Cerro Water System Project WTB #223 - Vencor - Construction Stage - Smithco - RD - \$5,420,147/WTB - \$4,371,630: 8" PVC water line installation completed on Mesquite Drain (Line M1) at Station 63+10. For Swannack I-beam crossing, Structural Engineer provided review comments on 3/31/15. Final crossing installation is pending pressure tests and Bac-T's. 6" PVC water line installations completed at Cebolla, Ward Road, Tarin Road, Tarin South, Myers and Coleman. 10,729 LF installed of 6" PVC C900 pending pressure tests and Bac-T's. Service Bores completed on Aceitunas, Emerson and Hawthorne. 2' potholes made when locating gas main as requested and approved by DAC. Installed 200 LF 1" Poly connection to the Mesquite Water office. All components in place and connection fully operational. Mesquite Park and Mesquite Elementary School are connected to Line B. All pressure tests and Bac-T's performed and passed. With the exception of a portion of Line B (i.e., Edward's dogleg and NM 478), all Mesquite Service Area water lines have passed pressure tests with Bac-T's pending. RE: RECOMMENDATION REGARDING AWARD OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT FOR THE WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT PROJECT IN BRAZITO, NEW MEXICO

Dear Ms. Nichols:

Bids were opened for the Lower Rio Grande Public Water Works Authority (PWWA) Water System Improvement Project in Brazito on March 16, 2015 at 521 St. Valentine La Mesa, NM 88044. Eight bids were received for the project and all bid packages were determined to be complete at the time of bid opening. The apparent low bidder was *Western Building and Development*. The total of the Base Bid ranged from four hundred six thousand four hundred sixty-two dollars and sixteen cents (\$406,462.16) to six hundred two thousand five hundred thirty six and zero cents (\$602,536.00). The total with the Meter Additive Alternative #1 ranged from four hundred fifteen thousand two hundred and forty seven cents (\$415,200.47) to six hundred seven thousand nine hundred thirty six and zero cents (\$607,936.00). Based on a review of the bids the low bidder has been identified responsive, thus the low bidder *Western Building and Development* with a Base bid amount of \$406,462.16 and a total amount with the bid alternative of \$415,200.47 is recommended as the responsive low bidder. Please refer to the attached bid tabulation spreadsheets for a detailed breakdown of the bids received.

Souder, Miller and Associates (SMA) investigated Western Building and Development's past experience by virtue of the references provided by Western Building and Development. The references contacted by SMA illustrated limited experience with comparable waterline projects and also noted that mobilization issues had occurred on a prior project of similar value. Please refer to the References Contacted sheet included.

Considering the Base Bid presented by the low bidder, as well as the verification of qualifications of the company to perform the work associated with the project, SMA recommends award in the amount of \$415,200.47 to Western Building and Development.

If it is the board's position, an agreement should be reached to "tentatively" award the construction contract to *Western Building and Development* pending funding agency concurrence. SMA will then need a copy of the corresponding minutes to submit to the funding

and review agency, along with the Contractor's bid proposal, bid bond, qualification statement and compliance statement, to request concurrence from the funding agency in the award of the bid to Western Building and Development.

If the funding agency concurs with the decision of the board, the attached Notice of Award will be submitted to the contractor. The contractor will then have 15 days to deliver insurance, performance and payment bonds. Then the Notice to Proceed and Agreement between Owner and Contractor will be signed by Lower Rio Grande PWWA and sent to the Contractor.
